### First day : looking back and drawing lessons learnt

1. Welcome- DTP and AIPP-
2. Presentations on IP programme of DTP-
  - background, goals, objectives
  - Programmes implemented- regional and national
  - Alumni mapping - where they are? Maybe want to feature a few who are leading organisations, movements, etc?
  - Trainers from Asia
3. Reflections from alumni and trainers- **facilitated discussion**
  - Experience sharing - what was good about DTP training? Have you applied DTP learning in your work/advocacy? How effective have previous human rights trainings been in improving your knowledge, skills, etc.
  - What were the most important skills, knowledge, strategies/networks you gained from DTP? What has worked? What has not worked? Why?
  - Mapping out lessons learnt, gaps and challenges
4. Reflection on the importance of capacity building initiatives, mapping existing initiatives, their effectiveness and sustainability-
  - Where does DTP fits in all these?
  - Why is human rights and IP capacity building important amidst the current multilateralism challenges, authoritarianism, and populism? (Open-ended)
  - To what extent has human rights and IP capacity building incorporated indigenous knowledge, practices and values? What more needs to be done? (Open-ended)
  - Are you aware of other effective human rights advocacy/capacity building initiatives within IP movements DTP should partner with? If yes, can you say what makes them effective? (Open-ended)
  - are their any existing capacity programmes implemented by them in individual capacity or their organisations? What tools, methodology, content delivery in your experience are most effective? What makes them effective?
  - How are organisations adressing the sustainability aspects? Are individuals we trained giving back to the movement?
  - What methodologies are used to measure training impact and sustain trained individuals in the movement?

## Second day: Mapping critical issues, initiatives, gaps and opportunities

1. Reflection on critical challenges facing the Indigenous Peoples today- facilitated discussion-

Mapping key critical challenges- use excel for real time documentation

- What are the new emerging and priority issues for Indigenous Peoples at the **global level**; update key developments at the UN, Climate change, Biodiversity Financial institutions, Business and Human Rights, ICJ advisory and GA resolution, Just transition, AI and Indigenous Peoples- mapping challenges and opportunities.
  - What are the new emerging and priority issues for Indigenous Peoples at the **national level** for IP; national laws and policies, implementation of global commitments and impacts on IP, change in governments- mapping challenges and opportunities

2. Indigenous Peoples response to the critical challenges and opportunities –Mapping responses of IPs to the new developments and changes
    - Mapping initiatives of IPs including capacity building programmes vis a vis new developments; how could this be strengthened in its effectiveness?
    - Mapping coalitions, other movements, initiatives IPs are part of in responding to the new developments, including the usefulness of such relationship
    - Examining values DTP can add to IPs capacity building needs- DTP's own initiatives/ programme and collaboration value with existing capacity building programmes of IP organisations
